Armed conflicts in the world in the last decades have caused millions of victims. A large majority of these victims are civilians who should be protected by the Geneva Conventions. In very difficult situations there are often men and women who struggle every day to put an end to violations of human rights, to enforce international humanitarian law and to prosecute war crimes.

On the occasion of the 60th anniversary of the signing of the Geneva Conventions, Rémy Pagani, who is Mayor of Geneva – the city which gave its name to the Conventions – visited war-torn regions in former Yugoslavia, Democratic Republic of Congo, Rwanda, Israel and Palestine to support persons and organisations who demand the enforcement of the Conventions. Several persons encountered in these visits will attend the public workshops to be held in Geneva from May 6 to 8, 2010.

The public workshops will offer an opportunity for hearing and talking with representatives of citizen's movements engaged in the struggle to ensure the respect and the enforcement of the Geneva Conventions, which is one of the main instruments of international law aimed at protecting civilian populations in situations of armed conflict and occupation.
